The Young Person's Guarantee

- The YPG is a Scottish Government initiative to improve opportunities for 16- to 24-year-olds in the wake of the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Overall goal is to ensure that every young person has access to an apprenticeship, fair employment, formal volunteering, training, or higher/further education.
- Delivery is conducted independently by each local authority. In Edinburgh, the YPG is delivered across existing and newly commissioned provisions (creation of Joined Up for Young People strategy)
- Coordinated by a dedicated team at Capital City Partnership, in partnership with wider CEC team.

Who we are:

A team of YPG Officers and YPG Manager.

What we do:

Deliver YPG locally through creation of Joined Up for Young People Strategy:

- Monitor and coordinate activity across the Youth Employability Partnership, Joined Up for Young People Network, and Young Persons' Panel.
- Commission new services to enhance current JUfYP offer.
- Work with partner organisations (via new JUfYP Network) to develop, support, and coordinate opportunities (employment, volunteering, training, and higher/further education) for young people across Edinburgh.
- Work directly with young people, supporting them to access the JUFYP Network and Labour Market opportunities if no other support available.

Roles of YPG Officers

YPG team work with key groups and organisations involved in employability-related provision across the city:



Education Officer works with higher/further education and services supporting school leavers – widening participation.



Inclusion Officer supports delivery of more inclusive programmes for young people from protected groups.



Training Officer works with training providers and sector based academies – ensuring alignment to Labour Market need.



Employment & Volunteering Officer coordinates meaningful and sustainable work opportunities.







Young Person Referral Service

- AA/SDS is first point of support for all school leavers.
- Young people aged 16-24 (or up to 26 for care-experienced young people)
 can self-refer into the YPG offer or be referred by other organisations
 across the city. YPG team act as a gateway to opportunities available
 throughout our networks and supports with onward progressions.
- While focus is on signposting and assessment of existing opportunities, YPG team will also be commissioning new provision where appropriate to address gaps in existing provision.
- Our goal is to ensure that young people are supported in a consistent and connected way at each stage of their journey across the JUfYP network.





Stage 1: referral, engagement and assessment

Outreach, supporting people into regular activity and positive routines

Stage 2 - needs assessment and barrier removal

Assessment of clients needs, addressing barriers to employment/training

Stage 3 - vocational activity

Delivering accredited training, employability training and job search advice

Stage 4 - employer engagement and job matching

Arranging work or volunteer placements, matching job-ready clients to jobs

Stage 5 – in-work support and aftercare

Supporting individuals to maintain and progress within the workplace

JUfJ Customer Charter (previously JUfl Charter)

- JUfJ Customer Charter replaces the previous Integration Charter no need to reapply
- Encourages sharing best practice and working together
- Six principles: Accessibility; Customer Focused; Maintaining Partnerships; Employer Engagement; Privacy; Fair Work

Young Person's Guarantee Grants

Application deadline: Noon, 24th August 2021

Inspire disengaged young people by creating new & innovative engagement programmes that support them to progress into the Joined Up for Young People Network at completion.

- £10,000 total fund
- £500-£1500 available per application
- Maximum 2 applications per organisation
- For projects delivered in **City of Edinburgh**
- Grant must be spent within 6 weeks
