Cyrenians

Key To Potential have a current caseload of 51 YPs and have engaged with 73 YPS so far this year. In Lockdown Remote Outreach worked very well. Cross Cyrenians co-operation. We are working well beyond expected capacity with more referrals coming in all the time. Kirsty has assisted quite a few YPs onto Enable training and we are keeping in touch with all the YPs we have assisted into college. We got some funding for a pilot Covid19 transition project for face to face (but socially distant COVID-19 compliant) "Key to Work" We partnered with WorkingRite to deliver a 4 week pilot and a second 4 week pilot with Dunedin Canmore AA in SW Edinburgh. "KeyTo Work" has had activities at our Kitchens, Creative Natives who hosted a Halloween spooky skull lino cut and printing session and at Cyrenians Farm Foundations "Officially" Supported 28 people so far this year. 10 new engagements in lockdown but we have had previous clients contacting us again for help and advice, especially around benefits.
