1. Net Zero Accelerator Hub (NZAH) Feasibility Study (Oct 2023 – Summer 2024)

Study will explore;

- Proposal to create NZAH addressing demand & supply barriers that currently exist
- Identify help for key sectors to accelerate their transition to zero
- Address skills shortages & translate into future skills delivery & job opportunities
- Sector needs (Construction, then energy & transport)

Outputs;

- Publish findings to local authorities
- Recommendations for localised action plan(s)
- With focus on skills & employment opportunities
